Raph L. de la Pieza is a newly-ordained deacon of the Archdiocese of Cebu, Cebu, Philippines. He finished his MA in Theological Studies at the Ateneo de Manila University (2020), Baccalaureate in Theology at Loyola School of Theology (2020), and seminary formation at San Jose Seminary (2020). Currently, he is assigned at the Parroquia de Virgen de los Remedios, Guindarohan Minglanilla, Cebu, Philippines as an assisting deacon to the Parish Priest.

Michael P. delos Reyes is an administrator in Xavier School, San Juan, Philippines. He earned his MA in Theological Studies at the Loyola School of Theology in 2004. His affiliation with the Jesuits, both in Xavier School and at the Ateneo de Manila, inspired him to write about the early Jesuit missions, especially in the Residencia of Antipolo. These articles were featured in *The Windhover*, the magazine of the Philippine Jesuits. He has also been assisting parishes in updating the novena to their patron saints in the Archdiocese of Manila and in the Dioceses of Antipolo, Kalookan, Malolos, Pasig, and San Pablo, all in the Philippines.

Joseph Y. Haw SJ entered the Philippine Province of the Society of Jesus on May 30, 1999 and was ordained to the priesthood on April 17, 2010. He completed his Baccalaureate in Sacred Theology in the same year *summa cum laude* and graduated with a Master of Arts in Theological Studies in March 2011.
